# Importance of quality care

Studies show that children who attend quality child care programs are more likely to:

- ~do better in school
- ~get along with others
- ~less likely to drop out of school later in life
- ~become less dependent on social programs

The early years of life are critical to a child's learning and development. Quality child care programs help children get a strong start on the path to life-long success!

# **Colorado Shines - Quality Rating Improvement System**

Colorado Shines is Colorado's system to rate the quality of Colorado's child care programs, much like a star rating for a hotel or restaurant. This lets the public know the experience, quality and education of a child care site.

Child care programs who participate in Colorado Shines are committed to offering quality and continuous improvement. Ratings are from 1-5.

**Level 1:** Licensed by the State and meets basic health and safety standards

**Level 2:** Meets Level 1 and taking steps to improve quality

**Level 3-5:** Completed an intensive process to demonstrate high quality in health, safety, family engagement, well-trained staff & supportive learning environment.

### **Making informed decisions**



- Your child's safety, health, and welfare are your first concerns. Every program will have its positive features, but only you can decide what is most important.
- Write down your questions or concerns to discuss with the provider
- Take a tour of the child care, visit more than once
- If your child is older, ask them their opinion
- Consider the cost. Which child care meets the greatest number of your priorities? High cost does not mean greater quality.
- Trust your instincts, you know your child the best!

### **Looking & Listening**

Watch and listen to what is going on in the classroom or family home child care:

- Are the children happy and enjoying activities?
- Are the sounds in the classroom happy?
- Is the provider's voice soft and gentle?
- Does the provider seem nurturing, loving and responsive to the children?
- Does the provider respond quickly and gently to problems that arise?



## Helpful checklist for finding the right care

#### Basics:

- Does the program have a license and is it posted?
- Do the hours of operation fit your needs?
- Can you afford the fees?
- What do the fees include and not include?
- Does the program provide a parent handbook outlining financial obligations, payment schedule, holiday closing, substitute policy or process if family child care provider is ill?
- Are you in agreement with the curriculum policies and practices?
- Does the philosophy of education fit your expectations?



#### Activities:

- Daily schedules are balanced to include nap time, story time, outside play and individual time.
- Learning opportunities are plentiful and exciting
- Activities are designed to meet your child's age and skill level
- Meals and snacks are provided
- Toys, equipment, and furniture are safe, clean and in good repair and at a level where your child can reach materials
- Materials and toys are large enough to be considered a non-choking hazard
- Children are taken outside, weather permitting
- Sleeping area is in a quiet location
